What is the 'Catch-up Pupil Premium'?

The literacy and numeracy catch-up premium gives schools additional funding to support year 7 students who did not achieve the expected standard in reading and or/maths at the end of key stage 2. At St. Anselm's College we used CAT data and entrance exam data to identify our 'Catch-up Cohort' in the absence of SATs. At St. Anselm's College we use this funding for a range of in class, remote learning support and extra circular activities (As permitted) in literacy and numeracy.

Catch-up Pupil Premium Funding at St. Anselm's:

Our aim is to secure success for all by providing quality first teaching and learning. At St. Anselm's College we use a range of student information from transition meetings to baseline assessments, from student voice to identifying key barriers to learning, to ensure we know each and every one of our student's areas for development. This information is then used to create a strategic Pupil Premium Development Plan which is monitored, reviewed and evaluated at key points throughout the year. Impact is measured using both quantitative and qualitative data. The Pupil Premium funding is spent on interventions based on educational research from the EEF toolkit.

How we spent our 'Catch-up' Funding 2019-20:

A range of interventions were put in place to support those students who were not yet 'Secondary Ready'.

Examples of Interventions Included:

- One to one personalised interviews with the PP Lead
- Literacy and numeracy lunchtime and after school sessions
- Timetabled Library sessions
- Literacy and Numeracy Master Class session
- Learning Mentor sessions
- Targeted Holiday Booster Sessions
- Motivational Assemblies/Growth Mind-set Sessions
- CIAG – Trips and Visits focussed on Raising Aspirations
- Rewards
- Home Learning Facilities – Laptops
- College Youth Worker and College Counsellor
- Peer Mentoring Group
- Support from the EWO
- Support with Uniforms and Revision Resources

How do we intend to spend our 'Catch-up' Funding 2020-21?

A range of interventions will be put into place to support those students who were not yet 'Secondary Ready' in line with Covid restrictions. Interventions will be focussed on the specific needs of each individual student and will address any external or internal barriers to literacy and or numeracy.

- Focus on growth mindset and meta-cognition initiatives

- Literacy and Numeracy Master Class session
- Learning Mentor sessions
- Motivational Remote Assemblies/Growth Mind-set Sessions
- Rewards
- Home Learning Facilities – Laptops/Ipads/headphones
- SEN support as needed from the SEN team
- College Youth Worker and College Counsellor
