Dear parents, We have now completed 6 weeks of term and the halfterm break looms on the horizon. I am delighted to inform you that we have been able to return to normal routines and your sons' education has not been interrupted by the pandemic. However the local Covid rate is increasing, especially among the 10-19 age

group, so we must remain

vigilant.

May they rest in peace.

Covid-19 Guidance

Any pupils, or staff, who have been identified as a close contact of a Confirmed Case NO LONGER needs to isolate but must take daily LFD tests and is strongly advised to take a PCR test. Boys who have symptoms should have a NHS PCR test at a local testing site. All Wirral households can now access twice-weekly rapid symptom-free tests. Residents have a choice of attending centres in New Brighton, Greasby, Eastham,

Birkenhead, Bebington, Liscard and Heswall, or collecting kits to use at home. They can also be ordered online or through 119. We continue to distribute LFD testing kits to all boys and urge parents to ensure that your sons test twice weekly in order to enable us to keep the College safe and open. We have only had a handful of Covid cases this term but other schools have been severely affected and we know the virus is spreading among young people in Wirral.

12-15 Vaccination

As in other secondary schools the Schools Immunisation Administration Team (SIAS) delivered 240 vaccinations last week to boys aged 12-15 whose parents had registered their e-consent. A letter from them has been emailed to parents, and is on the College website, advising parents of further opportunities for Covid vaccination and the government's plans for Influenza vaccination. Unfortunately a flu epidemic is a possibility this winter!

Familiar Routines

Hair stylists and barbers are now open so all boys are expected to have hair no longer than collar length. No hair bands, ribbons or bobbles are allowed. Most boys already display full compliance with our rules and continue to look very smart!

Uniform:

As the weather grows colder I remind parents that boys in Years 7-11 are only allowed to wear grey sweaters under their blazers. Hoodies and

fleeces are not allowed and will be confiscated. **Covid protocols:** Last term's routines and protocols, which proved very successful, mostly remain in force. We have retained the same separate entrances and exits, with Y10 & 11 using Grosvenor Rd, staggered break times, the 1-Way system around the site and sanitising of hands at the start of lessons.

Face Coverings:

Students are still required to wear masks on public transport and the 611 & 612 buses unless they have a medical exemption. If your son travels on a bus or train to College please ensure that he brings a face mask or covering daily.

Academic Achievements: Centre Assessed Grades

The hard work of our students and staff was vindicated by the grades awarded by the Exam Boards in August.

Year 13:

74% of all A levels were graded at A*-B, 49% A*/A. 75% of all BTEC grades were Distinction+. 89 students have already begun university with another 11 starting degree apprenticeships. 51% of all places are at Russell Group universities and medical schools.

Thomas Hennessy and Divij Wankhade were both awarded 4A* grades. Head Boy Will Nicholls, **Deputy Head Boy Matthew** Ryan and Daniel Lyon have all secured places at medical school and Oliver Macdonald has a place to study Dentistry. Michael Hughes is reading **Modern History at Balliol** College, University of Oxford.







Year 11 GCSE

43% of all entries this summer were awarded grades 7-9 by the Exam Boards and 97% of our Year 11 students achieved at least 5 GCSE pass grades including English and Maths. Luca Marzin was awarded 11 GCSE grade 9s, Josh McAllister 10 top grades and Charles O'Connor 9 such grades, a reflection of their outstanding commitment to their studies and the overwhelmingly majority of our students received the grades they deserved!

Very few grades were appealed which confirms the faith of our students and parents in our procedures and the professional judgement of our staff. Our students are now well prepared for the next stage of their education.

Bike Safety

One of the more welcome results of the pandemic has been an increase in the number of boys cycling to school. The Bike Shed is full each day but we do have another bike rack by the Food Hub. Please be aware that the College accepts no liability in the event of an unsecured bike being stolen! It is noticeable that some of our cyclists do not wear helmets and we strongly recommend this safety precaution!

Mobile Phones

A reminder of the College Policy! Boys SHOULD NOT bring these expensive items to College as we cannot guarantee their security. If a boy in Y7-11 openly brandishes one it is liable to confiscation.







Any boy bringing a mobile phone to College does so at his own risk. Confiscated items will only be returned on Fridays after school. To reclaim an item, a pupil must bring a letter from a parent.

No Chewing Gum please!

Chewing gum is banned on this site, so please discourage your sons from bringing any to school. It causes mess and damage. Those failing to observe College rules will be deployed cleaning it off the yard and removing it from underneath desks.

E-Safety Update – Mobile Phone Use

Can your child gain access to inappropriate material on their mobile?

It is a wise parent that sets up restrictions on what their children can access on the internet at home. Notwithstanding natural teen curiosity, it is possible for a young person to be inadvertently exposed to inappropriate, unsuitable and highly disturbing material. Many young people now have 'Smartphones,' that give the user internet access through 5G networks. Even some of the simplest mobile phones can provide access through a web browser. Many parents do not realise that this can be 'unfiltered access.' Students can be exposed to exactly the same dangers on their phone that they might face from unrestricted and unmonitored access at home. It is therefore very important to make sure that the 'Parental Control Services' offered free by all mobile phone providers are switched on. This is not always automatically the case. If you are unsure, contact your provider and ask. If the

controls are not in place, then you can request that they are switched on for a particular number. The link below will take you to an Ofcom website giving more advice and contact details for all the mobile phone companies: controls-for-mobile-phones/

We provide our students with regular and clear messages, on such issues. Guidance is available on the College website.

Sweet and Drink Selling

Any boy found doing this on the College site, or buses, will be excluded and his stock and ill-gotten gains will be confiscated and given to charity.

16-19 Bursary Fund

The Bursary is available to students in disadvantaged circumstances or from families on low incomes, comparable with qualification for Free School Meals. If you feel that your son might be eligible he should collect an application form from Mr Morgan. Students who break the terms of the 6th Form Learning agreement, including through poor attendance, lose their eligibility for Bursary payments. Tax payers' money must be spent wisely!

Lost Property

If your son has lost uniform, kit, a coat or bag etc. please do not immediately assume that it has been stolen or is lost forever! We have collections of lost property at the College & at the Games Fields. Please feel free to come & check. Parents can do their bit by ensuring that your son's property is labelled or marked. Most of our collection is

anonymous of course!

No Lockers

Students do not currently have access to lockers as we endeavour to ensure social distancing. They should only bring books and equipment required for the day in question, in a transparent wallet or small bag. Large sports bags will not be allowed in lessons. This policy has proved very successful and we will continue it next year.

GDPR

Along with all public bodies and companies we are obliged to observe the new European **Data Protection Regulation.** We have appointed Judicium as our (corporate) Data **Protection Officer. Please see** our website for further details.

Hair Styles & Appearance

The College Policy is clear and unchanged. Boys who have shaved heads will be sent home until their hair grows, as will those with hair below the collar until it is cut. Please ensure that your son's hair conforms with these expectations in September. Dyed or highlighted hair is not **allowed.** These rules applies equally to 6th Formers. I am the ultimate arbiter of what constitutes an acceptable haircut. Only 6th Formers are

allowed beards and facial hair.

Uniform reminder

Boys in Years 7-11 are allowed only to wear grey v-neck sweaters under blazers, as **required.** No other colours are allowed and **no hoodies** are to be worn on site. Boys should wear black office-style shoes and no trainers, irrespective of current fashions! Any boy wearing inappropriate







footwear will be required to change into a pair of pumps which will be provided by the College. Non-compliance will result in a proportional sanction.

Pupil Premium

We have explained how we use the Pupil Premium on our website. If you believe your son is entitled to any of the additional support outlined there, please contact me at the College. This is broadly based on eligibility for Free School Meals.

The College provides additional curriculum support for Pupil Premium students and I urge parents to take advantage of these free opportunities to enhance your son's education. Mrs Cubbin has overall responsibility for this programme.

College Sanctions

Let me make it abundantly clear that College sanctions are not negotiable! Parents and students do not have the right to pick and choose whether to co-operate with the College sanctions system, including the dates of detentions. We will always listen to polite representations, but the simple truth is that such parents have almost always been misled. The Governors expect parents to set an appropriate example to their

Homework and Academic Expectations

We aspire to provide a Grammar School education for all our students, irrespective of background and circumstances. The key to this is high expectations, not only from staff but from parents and families as well. We

expect parents to monitor their son's learning, including homework, and to require him to spend sufficient time on it and to take pride and care in its presentation and completion. We seek to establish a culture where it is cool to achieve! Most of our students do very well and flourish at the College. Our ambition is that all of them do so and we need your support to achieve this! We also expect students to arrive at College fully equipped and ready to learn. Boys will not be allowed to disrupt the learning of others and will face appropriate sanctions if they misbehave. No boy who works

You can access this system through an app called MyEd. The parental mobile number is then linked to your son and information regarding College events, key dates, educational visits and attendance can be accessed. This will also allow you and us to send and receive free messages to and from school. We are in the process of updating the College interface on this system and ask that all parents, who have smart phones, download the app. It is also very important that we have up to date mobile numbers for parents and ask you to inform us if you have changed your number recently.

Keep Track of your son's Homework and Deadlines!

The College provides an online service for parents to keep track of your child's school homework and

deadlines. The service is free to access and available via the Internet and any Smart Phone. Simply visit the College website by typing in www.stanselms.com. On the school homepage in the 'Students' or 'Parents' drop down menus you will see the option 'Show My Homework'. Click on this to display a calendar-view, showing the dates when your son received homework from his subject teachers and when it is due for collection. Re: Gacha Heat

We have been made aware of several cases where groups of primary school aged children have been exposed to **highly** inappropriate, violent, and sexualised content made within a popular game called 'Gacha Life'. 'Gacha Heat' uses the characters and backgrounds from this popular roleplaying game and







its content currently presents a serious risk to children and young people. Gacha Life is a roleplaying and story board creation game. Users can create storyboard scenes, add text bubbles, props, and backgrounds on Gacha Studio. Gacha life has a rating of 9+ on the Apple App Store and 'E' for Everyone on Google Play.

Online Safety

It can be difficult to know how to talk to your child about online safety. From setting up parental controls to advice on sexting, online games and video apps, the NSPPC can help you to understand the risks and keep your child safe. Drug Abuse

We would like to make parents aware of a current concern regarding the use of **Snapchat** to order illegal drugs.

There have also been concerns reported around the use of nitrous oxide gas which can cause nausea, vomiting and hypoxia. This gas comes in small silver coloured canisters and is inhaled, as recently highlighted on television. Over the counter prescribed pills like Diazepam and Xanax are also being mixed with alcohol and causing serious

problems among local teenagers. Mrs Cubbin has emailed you advice and guidance from the Wirral Drugs Team. If your son has any such items in his possession you need to act and the letter outlines sources of support.

Banned Substances

The Governors have made the decision to ban so-called High Energy drinks from the site. So-called legal highs are already banned at the College. They are only legal because government scientific agencies have yet to analyse and ban them! Confiscated items will be destroyed.

Cyber Bullying

The College advises all parents to be vigilant regarding their sons' use of the internet. We have had to deal with some examples of on-line bullying during the past few months. Cyber bullying will be punished in the same way as other breaches of the Code of Conduct. Our sympathy is always with the victim.

Medication

Please ensure that the spare medication, you provide for your sons, particularly epi pens and inhalers, which are kept in our Medical Room, is still in date, or replace them with new ones.

The College will only accept medicines that have been prescribed by a medical practitioner and are in the original container as dispensed by the pharmacist. We will not accept medicines that have been taken out of the original container nor make changes to dosages.

Asthma

Many students at the College have been diagnosed with asthma. Please ensure that your son carries his inhaler with him at all times. We are happy to

keep a spare inhaler for him in the Medical Room. Please send it into College in a box, marked for the attention of the School Nurse, and clearly labelled with your son's name and form.

Powers of Search & Confiscation

The law gives powers to schools to search and confiscate items from pupils under the following guidelines. Thankfully, the College rarely has to exercise this power, but I feel it is important that parents and pupils are aware of it. The Headmaster, members of the SLT and Heads of Year have a statutory power to search pupils or their possessions, without consent, where they have reasonable grounds for suspecting that the pupil may have a prohibited item. Prohibited items include:

Knives or weapons, alcohol, illegal drugs, stolen items, tobacco and cigarette papers, fireworks,

pornographic images. Any article that the member of staff reasonably suspects has been, or is likely to be, used to commit an offence or to cause personal injury to, or damage to the property of, any person (including the pupil).

The Headmaster and authorised staff can also search for any item banned by College rules identified in them as an item which may be searched for. Banned items are listed in the College's Behaviour Management Policy. Staff are not required to ask parents' permission to carry out the search, nor inform them that it has taken place, although we would always endeavour to do so. Staff will contact the police should a pupil refuse to allow their outer clothing, bags and/or lockers to be searched. The College will not use this power without having reasonable grounds to suspect that a pupil has a banned substance. We







have the power to examine data or files on electronic devices if we have reasonable grounds to do so. We may also erase data and files.

Contact Details

Please ensure that all your contact details are kept up to date. It is particularly important that we have all current telephone numbers in case of illness, injuries, absence etc.

Parent Pay

This Is our parental payment system which is used instead of cash and cheques to pay for trips and equipment etc. The facility to pay for Music lessons and lunch money will be added in due course. We will master it!! We have adopted this online system in response to parental feedback. You have all been sent your own unique Username and Password. Please contact the Finance Office if you require any help.
