





#### **RE Assessment and Marking Policy**

## Key Stage 3

### 1.Literacy

Key vocabulary and religious words will be checked and mistakes highlighted.

## 2.Assessments

- <u>Assessed task</u>- one per unit as identified in the scheme of learning. Students will be given a level of developing, securing or mastery on this task using the Faculty stickers. Students will complete corrections on this work.
- <u>End of unit assessments</u> one per unit as identified in the scheme of learning. Students will be given a level of developing, securing or mastery on this task using the stickers. Students will complete corrections on this work.

KS3 Assessments and End of Unit/Year Exams will be marked and graded with a % and a level of Developing/Securing/Mastery

#### 3.Knowledge check

Every 3-4 lessons 6-10 questions that will be Peer/self-assessed- these will be evident in students' books.

#### 4.Homework-

Teachers are to set regular homework using homework booklets that are provided. Teachers will set appropriate tasks that will be acknowledge as complete.

# Key Stage 4

**<u>1. Literacy</u>**- key vocabulary and religious words will be checked and mistakes highlighted.

#### 2.Assessments

- End of unit assessment one per unit as identified in the scheme of learning.
- Exam style questions will be marked with a numerical mark

KS4 Assessments and End of Unit/Year Exams will be marked and graded with a % and a Grade 1-9.

**<u>3.Knowledge check</u>** – Every 3-4 lessons 6-10 questions that will be Peer/self-assessed- these will be evident in students' books.

**<u>4. Homework-</u>** to be set regularly – GCSE questions or knowledge tests.

#### KS3 and KS4 Standard check-

Once a half-term- Faculty detention if the student does not meet the expected standard. Students' books will be checked and stamped with standards met or not met stamp. Whole class feedback will be given

- Basic expectations College expectations poster- (E.g. underline dates and titles with a ruler, glue worksheets in, no unfinished sentences, capital letters and full stops, quote marks when needed).
- Corrections- Teacher will highlight the mistake by circling it.
- Teacher will give whole class feedback on common words misspelt and incorrect grammar.
- Student will find their mistake- they then either use it in a sentence in the correct way or write the word out three times depending on what is appropriate.
