
Boy Soldier Series by Andy McNab

A scientist builds a time machine and travels to the future. He finds that humanity has devolved into two races: the childlike Eloi and the monstrous Morlocks. His machine disappears, so he explores the future world.

Blood Red Road by Moira Young

Set in a violent future world, when Saba's twin brother is snatched by mysterious black-robed riders, she sets out on an epic quest to rescue him.

A gripping gothic novel. Billy is a street urchin, pickpocket and petty thief. Mister Creecher is a monstrous giant of a man who terrifies all he meets.






Refugee by Alan Gratz

Isabel is a Cuban girl in 1994. With riots and unrest plaguing her country, she and her family set out on a raft, hoping to find safety in America...






I am Malala by Malala Yousafzai
