Entrance Examination Policy

Year 6/7 Transition

All students are required to sit an Entrance Examination in order to achieve a place at the College. Students must achieve the pass mark in 2 papers.

The admissions number for Year 7 is 156

The examination consists of:	
Mathematics paper	Pass Mark of 55%
English paper	Pass Mark of 55%
Verbal Reasoning paper	Pass Mark of 118

Places are allocated according to the published criteria in the College Admissions Policy.

In-year transfer

Students who wish to transfer to the College at any time other than during the Year 6/7 transition period are also required to sit an examination and achieve the required standard.

During Year 7	Students will sit the Entrance Examination, a pass mark of 75% in Maths and English is required with a VR pass mark of 118. Final half term: Year 7 papers in English, Maths and Science and must achieve a Securing Grade.
During Year 8	Maths, English and Science and must achieve a Securing Grade. Final half term; Year 8 papers in English, Maths and Science. Securing Grade.
During Year 9	Maths, English and Science Securing Grade. Final half term; Year 9 papers in English, Maths and Science. Securing Grade.
During Year 10	Term 1 Maths, English and Science papers. Securing Grade Year 9.
	Term 2 Maths, English and Science papers. Mastering Grade Year 9.
	Term 3 GCSE Grade 5 in Year 10 GCSE papers in Maths, English and Science.

During Year 11	The College does not recommend the transfer of students in Year 11. Any	
	exception to this is at the discretion of the Headteacher.	

For any students who are unwell on the day of the exam and are unable to attend, the College must be informed by telephone by 8.00am and an alternative date will be arranged, provided a medical certificate is produced.

Students can only be admitted if there are places available in the relevant year group. If no places are available they would go on a waiting list for 12 months.

When they are more students who have reached the required standard than there are places available the College Admissions Policy / over subscription criteria will be applied.

If a student is unsuccessful they can re-sit an exam the following academic year (12 months after the exam).
