Impact: Inspires students to see sport as a vocation that can inspire, uplift, and serve others.

### **EDUCATION FOR JUSTICE:**

Topic: Exploring issues of equality in sport (e.g., gender pay gap, Paralympic recognition, racism in sport). George Shelton – not tackling people late.

Impact: Raises awareness of justice issues and empowers students to advocate for fairness, respect, and equality in and beyond sport.

### WORLD:

Topic: The role of political communication and media. Impact: Students learn to evaluate truth in political messaging and are inspired to share values of honesty, justice, and hope in modern democratic debates.

### **PROMOTING THE SPIRITUAL:**

Topic: The relationship between religion and politics (e.g., faith in public life, church-state relations).

Impact: Encourages reflection on how spiritual values influence governance and inspires students to consider moral dimensions of leadership.

### **BUILDING A CHRISTIAN COMMUNITY:**

Topic: Political participation – voting, activism, and civic engagement. Impact: Helps students understand the importance of active citizenship in building inclusive and supportive communities.

### **COMPASSION FOR THOSE IN NEED:**

Topic: Welfare policies, healthcare, and social safety nets. Impact: Builds empathy for vulnerable groups and inspires students to advocate for compassionate and just policymaking.

### **CONCERN FOR THE WHOLE PERSON:**

Topic: Human rights and personal freedoms. Impact: Teaches respect for the dignity of every individual and encourages students to value holistic wellbeing - political, social, and personal.

### STRIVING FOR EXCELLENCE:

Topic: Political philosophy – key thinkers like Plato, Rousseau, and Mill. Impact: Develops critical thinking, analytical skills, and academic rigour, motivating students to achieve excellence in debate and scholarship.

### **EDUCATION AS A CHRISTIAN CALLING:**


Topic: Leaders motivated by faith and justice (e.g., Martin Luther King Jr., Desmond Tutu).

### **PROMOTING THE SPIRITUAL:**

Topics: Prayer, Sanctity of life, and Sacraments

Encourages students to develop a personal spirituality

Encourages students to develop a personal spirituality, giving them tools for reflection, resilience, and a deeper relationship with God

### **BUILDING A CHRISTIAN COMMUNITY:**

Impact: Inspires students to develop their talents fully, fostering responsibility, resilience, and the pursuit of excellence not just academically but also in character.

Topic: The Life of Edmund Rice, Marriage, Holy Orders, Family life. Impact: Students see education as a vocation, realising their own potential to contribute positively to society and live with faith-filled purpose.
